

Circular Pillow Project by Angela Wolf

Throw pillows are such a great accent and a perfect way to add a touch of your own creativity! In this project, you will not only learn how to sew a pillow, but how to embellish the fabric with circles of yarn, ribbon, and decorative stitching. Have you ever tried sewing a perfectly round circle? Circles can be a bit challenging, even more challenging when sewing many circles; unless of course you are using the Brother Circular Attachment. This fabulous attachment makes sewing circles of all sizes fun, easy, and perfectly round. First we will start by embellishing the fabric with the circular attachment using both the couching and braiding feet. Then we will use the embellished fabric to make a throw pillow.



Supplies needed:

- [Brother Circular Attachment](#)
- Pillow form 14" by 14"
- 3 pieces 15" by 15" fabric
- All-purpose thread
- Various yarns
- Metallic thread (optional)
- 505 Temporary Fabric Adhesive Spray (505 Temporary Fabric Adhesive is a product of odif, USA, and Brother International Corporation makes no representations or warranties regarding such products.)

Putting together the pillow:

- Creating the back fold (on both plain 15" by 15" fabric piece)
 - Fold under one edge 3" toward the wrong side of the fabric and press.
 - Fold over another 3" and press.
 - Stitch along the folded edge to secure fold in place
- Layering the fabric:
 - Lay the embellished fabric with right side up.
 - With the stitched fold facing the center of the square, layer both back pieces with right sides of the fabric facing down. (see photo)
 - Align the corners on all three pieces of fabric.
- Stich around the square with a 1/2" seam allowance, stitching through all the layers to attach the back pieces to



the front pieces. (see photo with yellow dotted line – the yellow dotted line represents the stitching line.)

- Turn pillow right side out and gently push out corners.
- Press if needed. Insert pillow through back flap.
